## CONDITIONS.

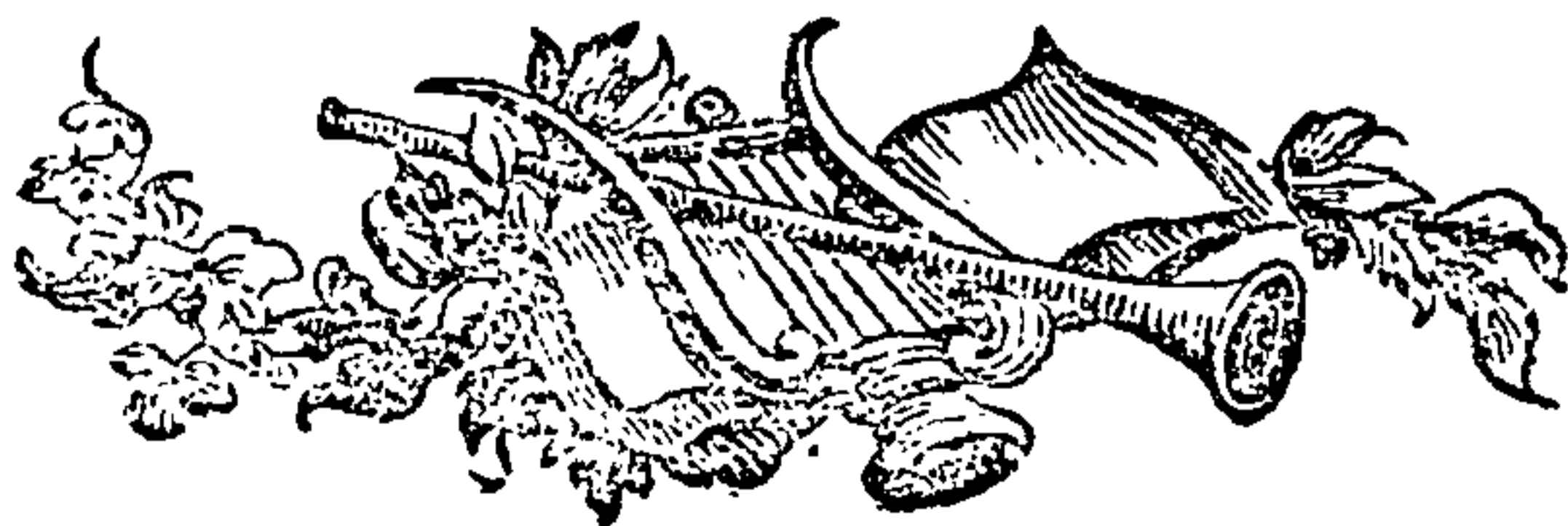
I. **T**HE Money to be paid at the Time of subscribing.
